- **Role of public health authorities**

 - Feed-back to prescribers

Reducing the Risk of AMR & HCAI (2)

- **Role of hospital management (national level)**
 - Antibiotic policy – antibiotic committees
 - Analysis of antimicrobial ecology and prescription
 - Implementation monitoring of guidelines
 - Infection control policy – IC teams
 - Epidemiological surveillance
 - Implementation monitoring of guidelines
 - HCW, patients and visitors education
 - Audits
 - National HH campaign according to OMS Guidelines
 - Good practices manual
 - **Role of healthcare payers**
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Reducing the Risk of AMR & HCAI (3)

- **Support of surveillance programmes**
 - AMR – Antibiotic consumption and prescriptions surveillance; AMR surveillance integrated on platform TESSY
 - HAI – Incidence studies (Helics ICU, surgery, NICU, bacteraemias, infections in dialysis); Prevalence study
- **Role of hospital accreditation programmes**
 - Use of HAI and AMR indicators (compliance with national surveillance programmes, national HH campaign, audits regarding AMR and HAI) by the two accreditation programmes (HKLS (King's Fund), JCAHO)
